Willi Hugo Pérez is Director of the Latin American Anabaptist Seminary (SEMILLA), a Mennonite Mission Network partner organization. With his leadership, SEMILLA has been able to draw together 12 different Anabaptist conferences from Mexico to Panama to study at Bible Institute and higher levels. In 2018 about 560 students participated in the basic formation programs or Bible Institutes associated with SEMILLA and 227 in the higher-level programs. With on-line courses, SEMILLA has the potential to reach many more students. For the churches of the region, SEMILLA has played a critical role in developing leaders who understand Scripture from an Anabaptist perspective. Welcome, Brother Willi Hugo!
