EXAMINING YESTERDAY AND EMBRACING TODAY

As you likely already know (hopefully!), beginning in August and going into the first part of September, we will be looking back at the history of First Mennonite Church (or-for some of us-maybe just the history of our own involvement with FMC). Then part-way into September, we'll shift into doing an assessment of where we have been in recent years which has culminated in where we are today.

These acts of looking back and assessing today are meant to be congregational activities. As we all add our own reflections into the mix, what emerges will be a picture of our corporate life together. It will give us all a sense of those values and priorities that we together hold most dear.

These acts of looking back and assessing today are part of a larger process. Before we look toward the future in clarifying our vision and mission according to God's leading, we need to see where we've come from. How has God already shaped our congregation? How has God gifted us as this unique part of

the Body of Christ? What is it that we have to offer to each other, to our community, and to the world that extends the reign of God so that "thy will be done, thy kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven"?

While it is the Church Board that will gather up what they hear and work at listening, discerning, and shaping the messages of vision and mission, your participation is needed. First of all, we ask you to pray for the congregation during the whole process so that we may be attentive to the word that God has for us.

And, second, we ask you to participate in the timeline exercises of examining yesterday and embracing today. It is what the Church Board will find through your reflections and responses that will provide the base material for whatever comes next.

After these first two steps in the process are completed, we'll finally turn our eyes toward the future. We'll ask for your participation then, too, to dream and think and listen and watch for the call of God to us.

CHURCH BOARD REPORT

The Board met August 11, 2016. Dave Wiebe led devotions with words and thoughts from Marty Troyer's The Gospel Next Door. He closed devotional time with prayer and Anita led a special prayer for Dana, Kathleen and Darnell Neff.

loel presented the upcoming congregational Vision and Mission process. The church board will be the leading group in this Vision and Mission process. Joel encouraged the board to listen carefully to everyone regarding this process. He presented and proposed the "Reboot" process and introduced three phases of the process. Joel asked for thoughts and input on his proposal. There was general discussion and affirmation for the process.

Dewayne Pauls updated the board on the Capital Fund Development Committee Projects that were approved by the congregation on November 1, 2015. Phase one (the roof repair) is complete. However, the roof fund is short by \$6300 which will be covered by the parsonage fund. Fund-raising is in progress for phase two (\$222,000) with emphasis on the first two items of the phase—window and organ re-

LINDA SHELLY WINS AWARD

Linda Shelly is the recipient of the 2016 AMBS Alumni Ministry and Service Recognition. Shelly is regional director for Latin America for Mennonite Mission Network. She has worked for decades in and for Latin America for Mennonite Central Committee and Mennonite mission boards. In the Fall, she will have an oppor-

pair and renovation. For the organ fund, about \$23,000 of the \$40,000 budget has been raised. There is hope that the organ fundraising will be completed by January 1, 2017. If necessary they will borrow from the parsonage fund to complete the project in 2017. If money is borrowed from the Parsonage Fund it will be paid back through finishing the fund-raising. It is church policy to pay back the Parsonage fund. The window fund is at approximately \$56,000enough to complete seven windows. It is not possible to complete the window project if the organ project fund-raising is not completed as there are not enough funds in the parsonage fund to cover both projects. Dewayne emphasized that all sizes of contributions are important to the fund-raising efforts. Pledges are considered cash.

FMC is planning 8 celebrations around the theme of stewardship over the next year. The first one is the Partnership Home Project celebration at Son Wray Ranch (near Newton) on August 20^{th.} There will be homemade ice cream and cake.

tunity to share with the seminary community about her ministry and will receive fuller recognition at that time. Linda Shelly has been instrumental in planning and organizing various Sister Care seminars presented in Latin America.

Dave Wiebe, Pastor Anita, and Pastor Kay shared reflections from the Western District Conference they attended. The Treasurer reported that July was a good giving month for local expenses but the year to date expense is about \$16,000 above income. The Property Committee reported the last couple of months have been busy for air conditioner repairs and servicing. The dishwasher will also need repair or replacement in the near future. They are looking at costs for both. The Gifts Discernment Committee reported they are working on the ballot for fall. The Outreach, Missions, and Peace Commission reported that Carla and Gary Histand will be sharing on the morning of August 21. In September they are planning a celebration mission evening and inviting short- and long-term missionaries to share their experiences through missions and the importance of missions. A freewill offering will be taken for shortterm mission.

Pastor Kay led the board in closing prayer.
