

College scholarship money is available—If you will be attending (or are considering) a Mennonite college, university or seminary in 2017-2018, you are invited to apply for scholarship funds from FMC. By no later than today, submit the completed application to either Jyl Ewy or Ron Dietzel. For each school year, an FMC application must be completed. Some Mennonite colleges provide matching funds so your monies would be doubled when enrolled in one of those schools. Eligibility criteria for the FMC funds are provided on the application. The form is available in the Court Area at FMC.

We invite each of you, ages 14 to 114, to complete the survey which GRACE (Godly Response to Abuse in the Christian Environment) has developed. Their survey is part of a review to examine the response of First Mennonite Church to issues related to sexual abuse. The survey is available online at www.surveymonkey.com/r/fmcgracesurvey or call the church office and we will email you a live link. If you are unable to complete the survey online, a paper version is available in the church office. Both the online and the paper version will go directly to GRACE and be completely confidential. Please complete the survey by April 26.
