

First Mennonite is generous—and has a strong tradition of providing support to students who are enrolled in Mennonite Christian affiliated schools. For the 2017-2018 school year, the congregation's generosity made it possible for the Scholarship Committee to grant awards to 20 students. 17 are full-time students and 3 are part-time. From existing funds, \$7,763 went to 7 schools for the upcoming fall semester. \$8,213 will be needed for the Spring 2018 semester.
