

Fifth Sunday of Lent March 21, 2021 **Transitional Information: Announcements**—The Search Committee has completed two interviews with a candidate and will be presenting this candidate to the Church Board in the very near future. If the Church Board affirms this candidate, the next step for the Search Committee will be to organize a candidating weekend of activities that will conclude with a worship service where the candidate will preach. A vote of the congregation will follow this weekend. This is an exciting possibility for the congregation and a big step towards finding our new pastoral staff. Please continue prayers for the Search Committee and Church Board as we move through the steps to finalize this candidate and as we continue to see additional pastoral candidates.

CHURCH BOARD DECISION: The Church Board made a decision concerning the future of the 510 East Second Street house at their March meeting. The house had a broken water pipe in the basement occur during the extremely cold weather we experienced in February. Since the house has not been used much by Casa Betania due to Covid restrictions on gathering, no one noticed the water in the basement until it was at the top of the basement steps and flowing outside of the house. The furnace, water heater, electrical panel were all underwater. The water was been pumped out of the house and the water and electrical service have been shut off. Because of the damage to the basement and the necessary services for the house to be usable an evaluation was done of the overall condition of the house and garage. It is in need of major renovation inside and outside of both structures. The options for the house were reviewed by the Church Board and it was decided that demolition of the house and garage would be more cost effective and better stewardship of our finances than renovation. A bid of approximately \$18,000 was accepted by the Board for removal of the house, garage, foundations, and driveway. The basement will be filled in and the lot will be cleared. The demolition of the house. garage, and driveway will be scheduled as soon as the utilities are removed from the house. Property and Nurture Commissions are working with Casa Betania to locate meeting, office, and storage space within our building. The Church Board felt strongly that we wanted to continue to partner with Casa Betania in use of our space for their needs. The Casita, as Casa Betania calls it, has been their small church for many years now and we want to recognize that this is a loss for Casa Betania. Please pray for the transition and for Casa Betania as they adjust to their new spaces with our building. ~Janice Good, Church Board Chair
