Continuing Our Learning from Diversity God's Design: June 17-20, Wichita will host numerous Juneteenth related activities and celebrations for the whole family. Google "JuneteenthICT" for a full list of activities. Consider attending one or more Juneteenth activities as a respectful participant. If you identify as white, you will also get the healthy and unusual experience of being a visible minority! Juneteenth celebrates June 19, 1865, when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas to take control of the state and ensure that all slaves were freed, two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Other ways white allies might want to observe Juneteenth could include reading one of the recommended titles about Anti-Racism from our Diversity God's Design curriculum, visiting the Kansas African American Museum in Wichita, or joining the advocacy group, Newton Community for Racial Justice, which meets at 12:00 PM, on the second Monday of the month (see Pastor Laura for more details).
