AN INTENTIONAL PAUSE: After prayerful consideration, the Church Board has decided to pause from church-wide conversation of MCUSA's Repentance and Transformation Resolution until September of 2023. At that time, the Board will revisit this topic and discern what, if any, further conversation we might be called to have at First Mennonite regarding this resolution. Individuals and small groups, of course, continue to be welcome to explore the topic of this resolution by talking with a Pastor or Board member, reading recommended resources, or watching MCUSA's "What's Next" webinar on the delegate resources page. Church leadership will simply not be guiding any church-wide conversations during this one year pause. Our reasons for taking a one year intentional pause are as follows:

- We desire any conversation we have around MCUSA's Repentance and Transformation Resolution to be unhurried and non-reactive.
- The Church Board wishes to allow time for us to better understand the impact this
  resolution will have on the wider Mennonite Church.
- The Church Board hopes that we can spend this coming year building fresh Jesuscentered relationships in the wake of COVID-19 and learning what it means to be a good neighbor to the community that surrounds us.
