

Restoration Visuals for Advent—The visuals in the front of the church represent restoration in several ways. The banner on the pulpit is torn fabric that is slowly being mended is done using visible mending (check out this concept on the internet). Over the weeks of Advent a picture will begin to form. The advent candles are surrounded by a forest that is slowly being restored. Finally the cloth beneath the advent candle was woven by Carol Goering and is the pattern The Star of Bethlehem which is an overshot pattern requiring the weaver to throw two shuttles alternately to form the design. The star signals the place where the birth of Jesus occurred which continues to brings joy and hope to all people. For a more complete experience you are encouraged to step up closer and see these visuals before or after church.
