The vision of policy is to help the church "strive to create a safe haven that encourages respect, equality, and kinship in Christ, which is free of abuse for all." We want to encourage all of us to strive to create this type of safe haven in our church community.

We know we are all looking forward to our fun labor weekend plans at Camp Mennoscah. In preparation for the event, we encourage you to review the Safe Sanctuaries Policy, but here are three "take-aways" from the policy that will help us provide a healthy environment:

- Our Camp Mennoscah weekend is an event in which parents are expected to be responsible for their children and any guests they bring, but we encourage all adults to be aware of the youth around us. Making sure that interactions remain visible and interruptible helps to ensure a safe environment.
- We encourage time in cabins to be in family groups with responsible adults and <u>advise</u> against a kids only cabin.
- If you invite youth as guests, remember to ask their parents for emergency contact I formation and any allergy alerts as you are picking them up.

With God's guidance and loving parental intuition, we will have such a wonderful and blessed time together!

Newton Et Cetera Shop August Volunteer Orientation—Are you looking at giving back to the community, to the region, or the world? Then volunteering at Newton Et Cetera Shop is were you need to be! August 24, 6:30-7:30 PM. Enter through the back door.

Historian and pastor John Sharp will join us at Newton Public Library for a special discussion of *The White Mosque: A Memoir,* at noon on September 8 in the Bessmer Room. This is part of our regular Nonfiction Book Club series, but anyone is welcome to attend. Sharp is a recently-retired historian who taught at Hesston College, and a former director of the Mennonite Church USA Historical Committee and Archives. In 2016, he led a tour group, which included the author Sofia Samatar, that followed in the footsteps of 19th-century Mennonites who traveled from Russia into Central Asia, where their charismatic leader predicted Christ would return. Samatar was fascinated not only by the hardships of the Mennonites' journey, but by its aftermath: the establishment of a small Christian village in a Muslim region that is now part of Uzbekistan – named Ak Metchet, or The White Mosque, after the whitewashed church the Mennonites built there. *The White Mosque* is the memoir Samatar wrote following her tour experience. It is a historical tapestry of border-crossing travelers, students, wanderers, martyrs and invaders, as well as a record of the strange shifts, encounters and accidents that combine

to create an identity. Sharp will share his deep knowledge of this "Mennonite Great Trek to Central Asia," answer questions and help facilitate discussion of the book.
