PLANNING GROUP NOTES: The Church Board has formed a Planning Group to format and develop a process for congregational discussions regarding LGBTQIA+ inclusion at FMC. We will be sharing on a regular basis reports of how their work is progressing through bulletin announcements. A focus statement, adopted by the Church Board is the foundation for the process. "The Church Board supports a process of exploring our Anabaptist and First Mennonite Church roots, discussing who we are as a congregation and discerning who God calls us to be in relationship to LGBTQIA+ inclusion."

Foundational to this process is the belief that we are all believers in Christ and wish to follow His will for FMC. The goal is to listen well and with care for one another. The Planning Group has already met twice with the intent of meeting until the second week of December, taking a break for the holiday season, then resuming their work in early January. The timeline for beginning the congregational steps will be a first step in January followed by at least two more opportunities in February and March. A summary of those meetings will be then we shared with the Church Board with a report back to the congregation. Please know these are our beginning plans. It is Planning Group's goal to be in communication with the church about what is happening and to give opportunity in several ways for the congregational to listen and be heard. The Church Board has contracted with Jon Friesen, member of Hesston Mennonite Church and lay leader for their process of discussion on this question, to lead the Planning Group and church wide sessions. The Planning Group members are: Jerry Regier, Betty Pauls, Lilith Jackson, Dave Wiebe, Pastor Luke, Cindy Combs, Shannon Bartel, Tyler Johnson, Laura Sharp, Joan Entz, Stephanie Weaver, Sam Claassen, Barb Claassen, Addie Kauffman, Jeff Kauffman, Michelle Regier, Erin Graber, Ken Regier, Janice Good. We ask for your continuing prayers for FMC, this process, and Holy Spirit's leading.
